Chief Ken McMullen, Chief



Chief Ken McMullen joined the Fire Service in 1997 as a Volunteer Fire Fighter in the M.D of Rockyview, Alberta. He was promoted through the ranks and in 2001, became a full-time Training Officer for Rocky View Fire Service. Ken later moved to become Fire Prevention Officer for the MD of Rocky View.

In 2003, Ken began work as a Provincial Fire Safety Officer with the Alberta Fire Commissioners Office. Ken conducted over 500 investigations in a 6 year period and was involved in over 55 fire fatality investigations.

In 2009, Ken became the Assistant Deputy Chief with the Calgary Fire Department. As a member of CANADA Task Force 2, Ken was deployed to the Slave Lake Fire in 2010, the Calgary Floods in 2013 and as the Task Force Commander to the Wild Fires in Fort McMurray. In February of 2018, Ken became the Chief of Emergency Services with the City of Red Deer.

Daryl Black is a sought-after author of the *1:100 Leadership Solution*, presenter and facilitator in Canada, the U.S., Australia and New Zealand specializing in leadership and human factors in high risk environments.

Ed Struzik, Writer, Photographer, Thinker

Ed Struzik is a writer, photographer, public speaker and a fellow at the Institute for Energy and Environmental Policy in the School of Policy Studies at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. For the past decade, he has been a regular contributor to Yale Environment 360, an international on-line magazine offering opinion, analysis, reporting and debate on global environmental issues.

His articles, essays and photographs appear in journals, magazines and newspapers such as Scientific American, Natural History, National Geographic, Ensia, Policy Options, Foreign Policy Review, Canadian Geographic, the Los Angeles Times, Globe and Mail, National Post, and Toronto Star.



Mr. Struzik has earned more than 30 international and national awards for his writing and his books. Included among them are the U.S.-based Grantham Prize, which honours and encourages excellence in writing on the environment; the Sir Sanford Fleming Medal, which honours one individual each year who have made an outstanding contribution to the understanding of science in Canada, and the Atkinson Fellowship in Public Policy, which funds research into some of Canada's most important and often most complicated policy debates

Mr. Struzik has written five books, and contributed to several others. His latest book, Firestorm How Wildfire Will Shape Our Future, (Island Press, Washington D.C, (<https://islandpress.org/books/firestorm>) is currently an Amazon.ca best seller. It was also shortlisted for the Science Writers and Communicators Association's book prize.
